## ORGANIZATION OF THE TEXT

**Formatting of Text.** The text of your paper should be formatted as follows:

- 10-point Times New Roman.
- The text should be set to single line spacing.
- Paragraphs should be justified.
- All manuscripts should be **maximum 6 pages long including pictures and tables** and must be written in strict accordance with the format provide

**Tables.** Tables (refer with: Table 1, Table 2, ...) should be presented as part of the text, but in such a way as to avoid confusion with the text. A descriptive title should be placed above each table. Table should be at the end (before figures) of a manuscript.

**Figures.** Figures (refer with: Fig. 1, Fig. 2, ...) should be supplied in an electronic format at a suitable size for printing with the following resolutions: 600 dots per inch (dpi) for line drawings and combinations; 300 dpi for greyscale and colour. Colour figures must be supplied in CMYK not RGB colours. Please ensure that the prepared

electronic image files print at a legible size and are of a high quality for publication. Figures should be at the end of a manuscript.

**Equation.** Equations (refer with: Eq. 1, Eq. 2, ...) should be one line of space above the equation and one line of space below it before the text continues. The equations have to be numbered sequentially, and the number put in parentheses at the right-hand edge of the text. Equations should be punctuated as if they were an ordinary part of the text. Punctuation appears after the equation but before the equation number, e.g. Equations should be centred and should be numbered with the number on the right-hand side.

References should be cited in APA format. References must be cited in the text mentioning the last name of the author and year between parentheses. In case of two authors, both should be mentioned. When there are three or more authors, mention only the first author followed by et al. When two or more references are cited in the same parenthesis, the authors should be in chronological order. And if they have the same year, they should be in alphabetical order. Moreover, if there is more than one reference of the same author and the same year, they should be indicated with letters. A complete reference should provide enough information to locate the article. At the end of the paper, in the References section the literature should be arranged in alphabetical order. If they have the same author, they should be in chronological order.
